12. PERMITS FROM OTHER JURISDICTIONS

Sometimes the work to be done on a B-Permit project requires a permit from a jurisdiction other than the City of Los Angeles in order to work, make a connection or a join. The most likely separate permits from an outside agency are as follows:

1. CALTRANS Encroachment Permit for work in a State Highway.
2. Los Angeles County Flood Control District Permit (LACFD) for connecting a City storm drain or lot drain system to a County mainline storm drain.
3. Los Angeles County Sanitation Permit for connecting a City sewer or house connection to a County sewer.
4. California Department of Fish And Game Permit for work in an "active" watercourse.
5. California Department of Water Quality Permit if the project "disturbs" an active stream bed.
6. Any project which abuts a neighboring city or county territory and joins at or across the jurisdictional boundary.

Whenever another jurisdiction is involved in a B-Permit Project, a note must be placed on the plans stating that the necessary permits are required. In addition, the Private Engineer or the owner must submit a copy of the required permit(s) before the plans will be release for construction. The Bureau of Engineering District Office must keep this copy of the outside agency permit(s) in the B-Permit Project file in the office.
